

## **Impact of Pupil Premium Spend 2015-2016**

Pupil Premium is funding directed at closing the gap between socially disadvantaged children and others. At Wargrave we aim to ensure that all our children have the right and the opportunity to make progress and have their needs met. Governors and staff are committed to ensure that all of the children in our care have the chance to realise their full potential. To that aim we are committed to creating a learning school with a culture of high expectations that does not limit potential in any way as we believe all children are special. Pupil Premium spending will be spent on minimising barriers to that speciality.

During the 2015 - 2016 academic school year:

- 44% of our children received a PPG at any point within the last 6 years.
  - 2% of our children were in the Service Children category
  - 2% of our children were in the adoptive from care category
  - 0.3% of our children were in the Looked-After Children (LAC) category

### **Impact of Attainment of EYFS children during 15/16**

Pupil Premium supported 13 Reception children during the 2015/2016 academic year.

- The percentage of children in receipt of Pupil Premium Grants working at expected standards in the different areas of learning was, on the whole, greater than the number of none pupil premium children.
- At the end of EYFS the average point score of non-pupil premium children was 34.7 and for Pupil Premium children was 30.4. This indicates that the gap between the two groups has closed from the previous year.

### **Impact of Attainment of Key Stage 1 Children during 15/16**

At the end of Key Stage 1 pupils in receipt of Pupil Premium performed better than other pupils in school and the Local Authority in Reading and in Maths and was in line in writing.

### **Impact of Attainment of Key Stage 2 children during 15/16**

- Disadvantaged pupils' attainment was higher than others in Reading and Maths
