Nature of support for 2015/16

Wargrave has looked closely at the needs of all pupils eligible for the pupil premium grant and the following interventions are in place

- We continue to provide a speech and language programme to diagnose difficulties early and provide an intervention strategy. We have a dedicated member of staff to do this.
- We also have 4 additional Teaching Assistants funded through the pupil premium to support children across the school
- We have a fully operating breakfast and after school club with 2 additional members of staff
- We have also subsidised many school trips. Our school values life experiences and our staff know how much the children gain from visits to aid their learning
- We have a dedicated teacher and learning support teacher working in our Inclusion Base
- We have purchased additional equipment to support reading (the investment in reading materials has been significant) and IT (we have purchased iPads, a green screen and a smart table) in particular.
- Our Inclusion Base continues to be funded
- We engage in activities such as the media bus to support the more able children who are in receipt of the Pupil Premium allocation
- Targeted group work for the more able in year 1 and year 6 through the use of a dedicated LSA
- Enrichment activities such as school show productions (costs of costumes, equipment etc.), visit to the Clonter Opera Farm, wow! Days and special themed weeks. We also regularly invite specialised provision into school such as artists, musicians (including brass lessons) and authors
- Involvement in the Children's University to raise the aspiration of our children
